11/4/2025	Affinités Chardonnay	2023	Decanter	94	Subtle asian pear aromas are framed by saline minerality and a flourish of fresh white wildflower. Exuberant and taut, the palate threads the needle between expansive lemon curd, macerated peaches and whisps of sea salt tinger freshness.
11/4/2025	L'Ensemble P Noir	2023	Decanter	95	Blue fruits combine with dark florals, and a flourish of forest pine and turned earth. The palate is beautifully textured and classically Oregon, with taut blue fruits, sweet Oregon blackberry, pomegranate pulp, and a silken, fruited finish.
11/4/2025	Spirit Hill Chardonnay	2023	Jeb Dunnuck	96	A bright yellow/gold color, the 2023 Chardonnay Spirit Hills comes from volcanic soils in the Eola-Amity Hills and saw 40 % new French oak for 13 months. Here the reduction bumps up a touch with notes of white pepper and flinty lift that give way to green apples and salted lime. The palate has a more linear feel, with refreshing, ripe acidity, a floating, chalky texture, even length, and a floating finish. Drink 2025-2037.
11/4/2025	Bishop Creek Chardonnay	2023	Jeb Dunnuck	95	A youthful yellow color, the 2023 Chardonnay Bishop Creek sees about 25% new oak for about 13 months. In the glass it offers very delicate, flinty wet stone notes that in no way take over, and the fruit shines through in notes of honeyed lemon, ripe apples, hints of ginger, and elegant hints of vanilla. The wine is full-bodied and stays light on its feet, with balanced acidity and a silky texture. It's a lovely Chardonnay now with a more immediate feel for the range, and it should also cruise another 10 years.
11/4/2025	Affinités Chardonnay	2023	Jeb Dunnuck	93	From a blend of sites, including Bishop Creek, Spirit Hill, Von Oehsen, Pearlstad, and L'Angolo, the 2023 Chardonnay Affinites presents a bright yellow color and is a lovely blended wine with very subtle light reduction, featuring notes of wet stones, salted pineapple, and candied lemon. Aged in 26% new French oak for 13 months, it's full-bodied and light on its feet, with an elegant and delicate chalky texture and a refreshing feel that's also approachable now. Drink 2025-2032.
11/4/2025	Temperance Hill P Noir	2023	Jeb Dunnuck	95	The 2023 Pinot Noir Temperance Hill is from the Eola-Amity Hills, on volcanic soils on the lower bench of the vineyard .. It has a bright ruby/red hue and is vibrant with notes of cranberry cocktail, pine, potpourri, and crushed stones. Medium-bodied, it has a mouthwatering iron sanguine lift with focused and refreshing linear tension throughout. It has an underlying grip that can be attributed to the influence of the winds coming through the van Duzer Corridor. Give this another year and drink 2026-2040.
11/4/2025	Own-Rooted P Noir	2023	Jeb Dunnuck	95	Sourced from the vineyards of Bishop creek, Nysa and Hyland, the 2023 Pinot Noir own-Rooted is bright: in the glass and pours a youthful red color. It lifts with notes of cranberries, cinnamon, bright wild herbs, fresh roses, and orange zest. Medium-bodied, it floats on the palate with a weightless and balanced feel, with fine tannins and an even, long finish. I really like this one and think it should improve over the next 12-15 years.
11/4/2025	Nysa P Noir	2023	Jeb Dunnuck	94	Coming from the Dundee Hills, this wine takes on a youthful magenta ruby color and is highly expressive, offering layered notes of pine, spices, dark berries, cherry cordial, red highlights, and delicately sanguine, dusty earth. It's medium-bodied, with fine tannins and a lovely linear drive, though it remains ripe and approachable. It's a lovely wine all around, and I would be thrilled to drink it over the coming 10-12 years.
11/4/2025	Momtazi P Noir	2023	Jeb Dunnuck	96	The 2023 Pinot Noir Momtazi is from a section within the higher volcanic elevation section of 115 and 114 clones. Coming from this more exposed site with more intense-winds, it displays a notably deeper red/magenta color and packs in a great deal of intensity and acidity. Offering a deeper and more savory richness in its notes of black cherries, black tea leaf, rocky earth and brambly herbs it's full-bodied on the palate, retaining bright acidity that's well-integrated into the fabric of the wine. It's built to last over the long haul and drink 2027-2042.
11/4/2025	L'Ensemble P Noir	2023	Jeb Dunnuck	93	With 26% new oak in this riper vintage, the bright red 2023 Pinot oir L'Ensemble is sourced from all the vineyards they use. In the glass, it shows off notes of ripe cherries, forest herbs, pomegranate, pressed flowers, and fresh orange peel. Medium-bodied, it retains a lovely, refreshing nature in this wanner vintage, offering a lot of pleasure upfront, with a 'wide window for enjoyment over the next 8-10 years.
11/4/2025	Bishop Creek P Noir	2023	Jeb Dunnuck	94	A bright ruby/red color, the 2023 Pinot Noir Bishop Creek opens to ripe notes of black raspberries, cherry cordial, crushed flowers, toasted cedar, and dark stones, with more forest earth as it opens. Medium-bodied, it has a ripe feel, with an approachable upfront character, fine tannins, and a silky texture. Notes of tea leaf, hints of truffle earth and dark stones are present throughout the finish. It's drinking well now, but it should also age gracefully over the next 10 years.
11/2/2025	Temperance Hill P Noir	2023	Vinous	94	Dusty and darkly floral, with a whiff of mentholated herbs, incense and clove paving the way for dried strawberries. Silken in character, it envelops the palate with ripe red and blue fruits, taking on an almost crunchy sensation as grippy tannins and mineral tones cascade across the senses. The finish is long and structured, with a pleasantly bitter tinge of blackberry and licorice as violet inner florals slowly fade.
11/2/2025	Momtazi P Noir	2023	Vinous	94	Darkly floral, offering a brooding blend of wild herbs, blackberries and wet stones. Silken and pliant yet acid driven, it reveals depths of floral-laced red and black fruits that slowly saturate as sweet inner lavender tones resonate. The finish tapers off with a sweet-and-sour interplay as a hint of blood orange mingles with chewy red currant saturation.
11/2/2025	Spirit Hill Chardonnay	2023	Vinous	94	Wafts up with a beguiling bouquet of dusty sage, tarragon, stone dust and nectarine. Flinty green apple tones and crunchy minerality wash across the palate, all energized by juicy acidity. This wine is intensely fruity yet focused, tapering off with lemony concentration and supreme freshness.
11/2/2025	Own-Rooted P Noir	2023	Vinous	93	Mixes licorice with crushed raspberries and shavings of cedar to create a seductive bouquet. Playful in feel, it possesses crisp red berry fruit as zesty acidity enlivens a core of citrus and minerals. Tart concentration leaves the palate salivating for more as a hint of cranberry pinches at the cheeks. A total pleasure to taste. The Own-Rooted blends fruit from Hyland, Bishop Creek and Nysa vineyards.

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11/2/2025	Bishop Creek Chardonnay	2023	Vinous	93	Sweetly scented, with nuances of crushed stone and mint giving way to lemon sorbet and apricot. It feels soothingly round, with crisp pit fruit cascading across the palate while a gentle spike of citrus adds form toward the close. Saline concentration lingers, mixed with pleasant flintiness, as the 2023 finish long and youthfully tense.
11/2/2025	Affinités Chardonnay	2023	Vinous	93	Wafts up with a pleasantly rich blend of almond custard, chamomile and gingery spice. Elegance and a soothingly round feel define the palate, with silken textures and opulently ripe orchard fruit balanced by a core of stimulating acidity. The 2023 finishes with tension, leaving behind nuances of nectarine and a lemony concentration that curls the tongue.
11/2/2025	Nysa P Noir	2023	Vinous	93	Dusty and floral, with rose and violet tones complementing spiced black cherries. Bright and nearly electric on the palate, it mixes tart cranberry with sweet herbs and crunchy mineral tones over a stream of juicy acidity. The finish is long and gently tannic, with a slight sour citrus twang that maintains the 2023's lively personality.
11/2/2025	L'Ensemble P Noir	2023	Vinous	93	A whiff of sweet lavender, basil and sage gives way to crushed wild strawberries and nuances of autumnal spice as the 2023 Pinot Noir L'Ensemble evolves in the glass. Ripe red and blue fruits soothe the senses, elevated by a cascade of inner florals, while a pulse of tantalizing acidity maintains fantastic energy. A sour citrus twang pinches at the cheeks as the 2023 tapers off with sweet herbal tones and a tinge of licorice that calls the taster back to the glass for more.

Bishop Creek is incredibly pretty and full of energy.

The palate is supple yet focused, showcasing flavors of cherry compote, blood orange peel, and wild dried herbs, all carried by fine, silky tannins. A mineral thread and lively acidity weave through the mid-palate, bringing clarity and lift to the wine's generous core of fruit. The finish is long and refined, echoing with whispers of anise, damp forest floor, and white pepper. Highly recommended.

On the palate, it glides with effortless balance, layering red plum and crushed herbs over a core of mineral energy. The bouquet opens with vibrant aromas of wild strawberry, cherry blossom, and blood orange zest, interwoven with touches of cardamom, lavender, and a trace of cedary herbs. On the palate, it is sleek and refined, gliding effortlessly with flavors of red plum, raspberry, and crushed herbs layered over a core of bright minerality. The tannins are silky yet structured, lending definition to the wine's graceful frame, while lively acidity adds lift and clarity. The finish is long and whisper-soft, trailing with notes of citrus peel and subtle floral tones that echo long after each sip. Highly recommended.

On the palate, it is vibrant and focused, with flavors of white nectarine, citrus zest, and subtle brioche weaving through a silky, mineral-laced texture. A fine spine of acidity provides lift and precision, while the wine's gentle richness gives it depth and quiet power. The finish carries on with notes of peach skin and sea spray, leaving an impression of purity and poise.

Aromas of acacia blossom, lemon curd, and Bartlett pear rise gracefully, joined by nuances of toasted hazelnut, white tea, and wet stone. The palate unfolds with layered precision, revealing flavors of white peach, preserved lemon, and green apple framed by a fine mineral thread and a whisper of spice. Its texture is weightless yet complete, with bright acidity giving lift and tension to the wine's elegant structure. The finish glides on with lingering notes of citrus zest, honeysuckle, and crushed rock, leaving a lengthy ending. Highly recommended.

Aromas of lemon verbena, white peach, crushed seashells, and apricot skin mingle with delicate hints of orange blossom and flint. The palate is finely etched and mineral-driven, revealing layers of green apple, white nectarine, and salted pineapple woven into a silken texture. A precise thread of acidity keeps the wine taut and focused, while a faint echo of roasted almond and citrus peel lingers toward the finish. Pair with grilled halibut and preserved lemon salsa or a citrus and fennel salad to accentuate its saline minerality and lifted energy. Highly recommended.

Aromas of Bing cherry, wild strawberry, and violet flower emerge gracefully, accented by hints of cedary herbs, crushed wet stone, and a trace of orange zest. The palate is vibrant and pure, offering layers of strawberry, pomegranate seeds, and baking spice that glide effortlessly over a refined tannin structure. Its texture feels silken yet energetic, lifted by bright acidity that gives the wine both balance and drive. The finish lingers with whispers of dried herbs and floral perfume.
10/7/2025	Temperance Hill P Noir	2023	International Wine Report	97	The 2023 Nicolas Jay Temperance Hill Pinot Noir from the Eola-Amity Hills glows a vivid ruby with garnet edges, revealing its depth and vitality. Sourced from 30-year-old vines rooted in volcanic soils, it opens with captivating aromas of black raspberry, dried sage, cracked peppercorn, and crushed basalt, mingled with hints of rose petal and smoked tea. On the palate, the wine is both dynamic and composed, delivering layers of dark cherry and wild herbs woven together by fine, chalky tannins. A current of bright acidity provides lift and definition, while a saline undertone adds precision and nuance. As it unfolds, the wine reveals an elegant tension between its earthy power and crystalline purity. The finish lingers with tones of graphite, dried florals, and blood orange, reflecting both the restraint and strength that define the site. This Pinot Noir feels like standing atop an Oregon ridgeline after a rainstorm - crisp air, damp earth, and sunlight breaking through the clouds, serene yet electrifying. Highly recommended and editor's choice.

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10/7/2025	Momtazi P Noir	2023	International Wine Report	96	The 2023 Nicolas Jay Momtazi Vineyard Pinot Noir from McMinnville shimmers a deep garnet with flashes of magenta at the rim, hinting at both concentration and vibrancy. Aromas of black cherry, wild thyme, and iron-rich earth mingle with hints of clove, crushed flower petal, and flint. On the palate, the wine reveals dark, savory complexity, unfolding with layers of boysenberry, damp earth, and peach skin accented by touches of dried herbs and truffle. The texture is firm yet graceful, supported by taut acidity and finely knit tannins that speak to both structure and longevity. A mineral pulse runs through the wine, adding energy and tension as it builds toward a lingering finish of spiced plum, cedar, and wet stone. Pair this with rosemary-crusted venison loin or porcini mushroom risotto to bring out its earthy depth and refined power. Highly recommended.

12/3/2024	Bishop Creek P Noir	2022	Matthew Jukes	19.5+/20	From the home vineyard, own-rooted in blocks 1, 3 and 4, which were planted in 1987 and 1988, this is such a serious wine I needed to sit in my chair for half an hour after I logged off the video call with the chaps to pull this wine apart carefully and forensically study its mechanics. Closed, powerful and commanding, this is one of the finest Pinot experiences of the year, yet nothing is obvious, overt or easy. This wine epitomises quiet confidence, and there is a monastic silence about how it delivers its messages. Imposingly deep, purple-ink-hued and breathtakingly classy wine, this is yet another wine that demands patience and commitment to allow it enough time to age gracefully – this might be a decade, making it one of the most long-lived of all Nicolas-Jay wines. This is the master of this family of Pinots, the slowest to evolve, the all-seeing eye, and the cornerstone of this estate. It is spectacular.
12/2/2024	Nysa P Noir	2022	Matthew Jukes	19+/20	This is a typical Dundee Hills wine with forward, sweet-edged, ripe, red fruit notes and epic bitterness countering this exuberance. Unusually, it has a mightily impressive engine behind the delicate perfume. While teasing and plush, the fruit hides tannins that wait patiently for the moment to pounce. Always pretty and enchanting but with a hint of menace and crunch, this is a rhythmic wine with an unmistakable sense of the great wines from the 'Vosne-side' of Nuits-Saint-Georges, as opposed to the more earth-driven southerly sites. A quieter wine than the others, some might miss the cache of intent buried in the red folds, but the full peacock's tail of flavours will become apparent given 3-5 years (at a guess).
12/1/2024	Momtazi P Noir	2022	Matthew Jukes	19+/20	2022 Momtazi was a tiny crop, and with only 144 cases available, this is far and away the most sought-after cuvée in 2022! It is unusually open and expressive with ravishing fruit and spice notes over a mineral undertone, brittle crispness, and mouth-watering acidity. Momtazi always shows a touch of irreverence – and I love wines with attitude. If you love mineral-soaked Pinot Noir (akin to a great Nebbiolo), you must embrace this wild card and bathe in its joyous unpredictability. I must admit I did not see this coming. I am completely captivated by 2022 Momtazi.
11/30/2024	Own-Rooted P Noir	2022	Matthew Jukes	18.5+/20	This wine is a blend from vines that were planted on their own rootstocks, and in 2022, it is made of three different vineyards: Hyland (McMinnville), planted in 1971, Bishop Creek (Yamhill-Carlton) and Nysa (Dundee Hills). There are always florals and fresh herb tones here, and with Hyland's beating heart, the fruit notes are refined, fragile and sonorous. This couture style is marked by tension and length, and nothing is forced, too pushy or concentrated. This 2022 is a little tighter than usual, with a slender, shy and more reluctant chassis, and I like this finely-judged stance. Own-Rooted is always an outlier, with a touch of individuality and quirkiness that draws the drinker to the glass. It is a welcome change of pace in this portfolio and another wine that needs a few years to blossom.
11/29/2024	L'Ensemble P Noir	2022	Matthew Jukes	18.5/20	No fewer than nine plots of vines were used in this 'assembly' of flavours, and Jean-Nicolas and Jay decided to add fruit from Shea this year. They used Shea in 2022, 2023 and 2024, and they are keen to see if this fruit allows even more expression in the wine as it matures. The idea is that there is a possibility of retaining the trademark degree of 'L'Ensemble' complexity while hopefully increasing the volume of the blend. We shall see. On first inspection, this is a super-smooth and thoroughly delicious Pinot. Jay reckons it might close down and then blossom again later, and I feel this might well happen. I drank a 2021 vintage recently, and it looks quite firm in contrast to this open-armed 2022, but anything can happen! In 2022, there was less Momtazi used in this wine because of disease issues, so the chances are it will be a fruitier rendition. Spicy, ripe, open, and come-hither with delicate hints of cake spices over deeply rewarding summer pudding and hedgerow notes, this is an example of the art of blending – to make an infinitely more intricate wine than the stand-alone parts. This has been consummately achieved.

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11/28/2024	Bishop Creek Chardonnay	2022	Matthew Jukes	19+/20	Last year's 2021 stopped me in my tracks, and I was willing this wine on, perhaps channelling some of the nervousness that Jean-Nicolas and Jay were subjected to back in 2022. I need not have worried because Bishop Creek is such a stellar site; it always delivers its best. Phenomenal breeding and tension make this a linear, densely packed and unusually closed wine. This makes it a much more serious proposition, and it does not want to be distracted from its journey ahead. Staggeringly focussed, gloriously ripe and muscular, and with the sleekest flanks, while the hints of exoticism are shut down in seconds, with the latent power seeking to marshal any exuberance, calling a halt to any erstwhile celebrations, we only need one quality to usher this wine to greatness – patience. This is a truly spectacular (and, dare I say it, Grand Cru) creation!
11/27/2024	Affinités Chardonnay	2022	Matthew Jukes	18.5/20	Drawn from Bishop Creek (Yamhill-Carlton AVA), Spirit Hill (Eola-Amity) and Von Oehsen (Eola-Amity), this is an effortlessly classy Chardonnay with intricate layering of flavours from these three stunning sites. Ripe and controlled over beautiful pith and skin-derived acidity and bite, the balance is stunning, and the fruit notes teasing and invigorating with moments of balletic poise. Touches of generosity draw you in, and freshness and tension warn you away. While this is a delicious wine now, it would benefit from a further 12 months to shapeshift into completeness.
10/17/2024	L'Ensemble P Noir	2022	Wineanorak	96	A blend of Pinot from 10 vineyard sites, this is approachable but also ageworthy. Fine floral red cherries and cranberries on the nose. There's a lovely sappy edge to the red cherry and plum fruit on the palate with direct red fruits and real finesse. Nice energy here: very fine with good purity. 96/100
10/17/2024	Bishop Creek Chardonnay	2022	Wineanorak	96	From a block at the top of the hill. Fresh and detailed with crystalline citrus fruit. Supple and showing real finesse with some compression, this is taut and complex with well integrated oak. Lemon dominates the fruit spectrum, but there's some peach and pineapple in the background. This should age beautifully. 96/100
10/17/2024	Affinités Chardonnay	2022	Wineanorak	95	Four vineyards, around 15% new oak. Subtle toast and aniseed on the nose with taut citrus fruit. Lovely depth of flavour with lemon, pineapple and pear fruit as well as good acidity. Fine and linear, and ageworthy. 95/100
10/17/2024	Own-Rooted P Noir	2022	Wineanorak	95	This comes from Bishop's Creek (1987), Nysa (1990) and Highland (1971). They started making this in 2017. The sleek, delicious and vibrant middleweight flavors culminate in a clean and refreshingly dry finale that could use better depth so 2 to 3 years of cellaring should prove helpful.

I am all for making wines as good as they can possibly be, with no rules attached. In the music world, making a supergroup often ends in failure, but if this Pinot were a band it would be Audioslave. This rather signposts my own tastes in music, and it certainly means that I consider it to be a rare slice of genius. I do not mean to offend Jay, but I do hope that he understands my thought process here, if not my predilection for hard rock. In terms of the flavour, it is a soaring success with perfect-judged François Frères barrels keeping the wonderfully expressive fruit in check.
